MEETINGS

Meetings are held on the third Wednesday of each month (except December) at the North Shore Congregational Church, 7330 N. Santa Monica Blvd., Fox Point, unless otherwise indicated in the newsletter. The program begins at 9:30 a.m. but members can arrive any time between 8:30 and 9:30 a.m. to socialize and/or quilt. Coffee, tea, and treats are served after the program and before the business meeting. New members are encouraged to bring show and tell items. These are quilts that you have completed, interesting antique quilts you may have acquired, quilted clothing, etc. Show and tell is one of the perks of being part of a quilt guild. Members are encouraged to wear a quilted name tag so we can all get to know you. Feel free to bring a guest who may be visiting you from out of town or one who may wish to join the guild.
