April 17th Afternoon Workshop: Making an Antler Quilt Design



Braided Flying Geese Table Topper Project

Featuring Chatsworth Braided Flying Geese Foundation Papers
Taught by: Julie Karasek, Patched Works www.patchedworks.com

Techniques learned: Basic Paper Piecing, organized scrappy fabric placement.

Workshop will include 8 foundation papers per student. More papers will be available for purchase.

Supplies Required:

1 yard background fabric (includes border and binding)
8 fabrics for scrappy flying geese (more fabrics are fun – minimum 2 fabrics to see pattern)
5/8 yard backing

Precutting Recommended:

Background

Cut 2-5% Strips – Sub cut into 8-5% Squares – Cut diagonally once.

Save the rest of background for borders/binding

From **each** of 8 fabrics

Cut $1 - 6 \frac{1}{2}$ square – cut diagonally twice (Use only 1 triangle from each fabric)

Cut 1 – 2 ½" x 6" Rectangle

Cut 1 – 2 ½" x 7" Rectangle

Required Tools

Add a quarter ruler (a limited number of add a quarter rulers and glue sticks will be available at workshop.)

Glue stick

Pressing tool is helpful (Hera Marker or Seam Roller)
Small cutting mat for trimming at individual workstation
Basic Sewing supplies
Sewing machine

Students will complete a minimum two Braided Flying Geese Units. Some students may complete all 8 units and assemble complete top with borders. And don't forget to bring a lunch!

NSQG Love and Comfort: May Workshop on Next Page NEW INFORMATION FOR QUILTS

WHO: This is our NSQG charity quilt project

WHAT: Making quilts for those in need as they would appreciate a beautiful handmade/machine made quilt in their time of need (see below for instructions)

WHEN: Bring your "love and comfort" quilts to drop off at each of our monthly meetings and they will be taken to one of the receiving organizations to distribute.

WHY: To make a positive difference to those in need in our community using your remarkable quilting skills.

HOW: Now you can make two types of Love and Comfort quilts that will go to one of three places! Please read this before you make a charity quilt. Here are instructions:



- 1. NICU Quilts: We have researched needs at the NICU (Ascension Hospitals) and they continue to need 36X36 quilts -- but they only want baby/child prints (all cotton, no flannel). From now on, please only make the NICU quilts using child/baby prints.
- 2. **The "Open Door Cafe" for the homeless** (at the Cathedral of St John downtown) would love our quilts the sizes and fabrics can vary (48" x 54", 55 x 65, but any size will do). You could even use fleece for the batting and backing (a lot less expensive).
- 3. Columbia/St Mary's Hospital patients: you can make 40 X 60 or lap size charity quilts to go especially to older patients. Please use all cotton fabric,

PLEASE NOTE THE CHANGES ABOVE: if you have child cotton prints, make quilts 36"x36". For all other fabrics (solids, other prints, flannels) please make larger quilts for adults. Thank you for making the Love and Comfort quilts! They make a positive difference to the sick and needy in our community. WHAT: A hands-on day for all of us to gather together to make quilts for those in need (our charity quilt projects)

WHEN: May 15, 2024

WHERE: Our usual meeting location (basement of Northshore Congregational Church on Santa Monica). Large tables for sewing will be set up on the sides of the room, the stage will be the location for ironing, and tables in the middle will be for pinning.

WHAT TO BRING: Bring your partially completed "love and comfort" quilts to finish, or just bring yourself! Bring your sewing machine, iron, ironing board, fabric, quilt tops, notions. And don't forget to bring a lunch! We will have kits you can work on, or you can work on your own. We will have an assembly line – divide the tasks!

WHY: For fun! To make a positive difference to those in need in our community!

WHAT ARE WE MAKING: two types of Love and Comfort quilts, children's for the NICU (36 X 36, only cotton and kids prints) and adult (larger, any fabrics)





Carolina Oneto, appeared from Brazil via Zoom. She spoke on "Limits and Creativity: empowering our creative process". (caroniaoneto.com)










It may seem counterintuitive that placing limits to our creativity can actually make us more creative



Helping International Sewers Tanzania Sustainable Sewing Project

Outreach Request made by The Rev Mary S Trainor, guild member

In a small village in Tanzania, men and women are learning to sew and create their own businesses. The effort started with an international charity training the young entrepreneurs to make reusable feminine products enabling the village girls to attend school the entire month. The project has branched out to include sewing school uniforms and church vestments. Once trained, the sewers earn a machine enabling them to set up shop in a local community.

Getting fabric and sewing tools is expensive and the quality can be poor. **YOU CAN HELP** by donating fabric or sewing tools. Here's how to make a dramatic difference in these young lives. Donations needed:

Type of fabric:

Poly/cotton blends

Light weight fabric: Please NO fleece, heavy knits, upholstery fabric, heavy wool etc.

Design of fabric:

- Small prints (such as calico) will work for hygiene products.
- Solids (any color); cream, khaki, navy, light blue preferred if purchasing

Amount of fabric:

- On hand donations minimum ¼-½ yard for small print cotton fabric; 1 yard minimum for solid fabric
- If purchasing solid fabric, love to have multiple yards even entire bolt

Sewing Tools:

Scissor, rotary cutter

Thread any color

Sewing machine needles - Universal

Tape measures/rulers

Cutting mats

Pins and zippers
